o received certification as an instructor in Radar, Firearms, O/C and Driving. In 2002, he received an Associate Degree in Criminal Justice from Spartanburg Methodist College.

On January 9, 2004, he resigned as a Sheriff's Deputy to run for the position of Sheriff. In November 2004 he


