"Bang!" "Bang!" "Bang!" the sound of the shotguns reverberate across the valley at Camp Bob Hardin.



This means bountiful cracker-barrel snacks served both Friday and Saturday evenings This means a steak supper, egg-sausage-biscuit breakfast, sub-sandwich lunch, and two or more desserts after supper without a boiled egg or slice of white bread to be seen. This means a Saturday evening Halloween costume contest, a movie, and patch trading that goes on 'till midnight. The Ordeal weekend is done with. Fall Fellowship is your reward for surviving and earning your sash. At Fall Fellowship "I like sitting with friends playing cards at the picnic table in our Adirondack." "I like casting a fishing line into the upper lake." "I like that there are no obligations other than showing up on time for a meal."

Only those who are preparing for Brotherhood membership will be assigned service projects until it is time for their testing. Those who are involved with Indian Affairs may be under the shelter at the far end of camp, working on outfits or perfecting a group dance. A few may be practicing their stagecraft at the ceremony grounds. There will be a meeting for those interested in going to Michigan State University for a week at NOAC 2012 next summer. There will be a meeting (which we are all encouraged to attend) of our chapter chiefs and the chiefs of our executive board.

There are a few activities that some miss. Don't let it be you! Check out the Skyuka Lodge trading post. It has more than soft drinks and candy bars. Ask Frank and Eric Shytles or Bob White to show you the totem pole hat pin, the double-headed thunderbird key chain, and the patches available from last year's events. Go by the Nature Lodge where you will find Doug Bartlett has the NOAC batman patch for sale, a year ahead of the opening of the next batman movie. While there, talk with Zach Roberts, and any of the other Scouts in charge of our weekend, about leading a team of Ordeal candidates as your service for Brotherhood at our next fellowship.

Ask our lodge chief Taylor Thomas when the Patch Auction will be held. Be there. Traders contribute patches, flaps, neckerchiefs, slides, and event T-shirts that are often won for pennies-on-the-dollar. It is a great opportunity to get patches at a bargain cost. The bidding wars (sometimes with only a penny raise) are very entertaining.

Off to the side in the Dinning Hall after supper you will see Scouts and adults opening up day packs and plastic tubs. The patch traders have arrived. Ask to see what they have from our lodge and the Dixie Fellowships. At each fellowship you attend, you receive an event patch and you may purchase a Skyuka flap. They are eagerly sought by collectors in our lodge and by collectors in other lodges who could not be there. Ask Doug Chambers to show you some of the Boy Scout hat pins available, and ask him "What pins are 'hot' amongst collectors?" Talking with these traders is like going to an "Antique Roadshow." You may learn that you, your brother, Dad, or grandfather have a patch or a pin tucked away that is valuable! Have you seen a three feet tall, leather-bound book that levitates and at times disappears? Yes, there is one or more in the Hogwarts library. But we have one, too. At each fellowship we are expected to sign our lodge scrapbook. But where is it? To find the book we must ask the chapter chief for our district in Palmetto Council. Ask until you know who he is, meet with him, ask him when and when the chapter meets, and ask him where to find the lodge scrapbook. Sign it on the page designated for the event you're attending and be forever recorded as an active member in Skyuka Lodge. Your challenge is to find the book. W.W.W.

The Palmetto Council has been granted spots for 3 Jamboree troops and 2 Venture patrols for the 2013 Jamboree. Each Jamboree troop will consist of 40 Scouts and 3 adult leaders over 25 years old and 1 adult leader 18-25. Each Venture patrol will be comprised of 9 youth and 1 adult or 8

youth and 2 adults depending on the male/female crew make up.
